# Students from 15 Louisiana High Schools Explored Careers at YouthForce NOLA + Junior Achievement Career Expo

## Seventy-three professionals gave students an inside look at high-demand, high-wage careers

**New Orleans, La. (Mar. 22, 2021) –** More than 1,500 students from 15 high schools across Southeast Louisiana participated in the YouthForce NOLA + Junior Achievement Career Expo on March 8-11, 2021. The live virtual career exploration event convened 73 professionals and training providers in high-wage, high-demand industries to share insights to help students consider options for their future careers.

"Through the Career Expo, we're engaging young people early on to consider their career options and the steps they can begin taking now to pursue them. This type of exploration is an important phase in a continuum that is connecting public school students to high-wage career pathways," said Cate Swinburn, president of YouthForce NOLA. "Most high school students aren't aware of the full spectrum of opportunities available to them. So we're connecting our young people with working professionals to get an inside look at high-wage jobs and how to pursue them," said Larry Washington, the president of Junior Achievement of Greater New Orleans. "It's essential that these types of career readiness programs are integrated into the K-12 experience, and we're grateful to the schools who share our vision and continue to partner with us."

The YouthForce NOLA + Junior Achievement Career Expo is part of a broad effort that is building a pipeline to meet our region's fast-growing industries' workforce demands. The results: more prosperous graduates, employers, and communities.
